








Respondents mark their answers directly on the map




How Maptionnaire works

aalto.fi email




2. Wait for the invitation


The admin user of your organisation will invite your user account to your Maptionnaire team



3. Accept the invitation Login to your user account to accept the invitation




Structure of the Maptionnaire platform





3) Starting a new questionnaire


- Start a new questionnaire draft
- Add questionnaire pages to your draft
- Add contents on the pages
 - Question elements (multiple choices, map questions, open questions...)
 - Content elements (images, text, videos, links...)






How to start a new questionnaire

1) Select the section "Questionnaires" at the top of the page






Editing the questionnaire draft





Where to find settings? 1/2




General survey settings - All the basics regarding the whole questionnaire

- General: Questionnaire start and end times, maintain respondent session, privacy and consent
- Language: select other language versions
- Style: Change layouts, add numbering
- Card: manage how the questionnaire appears on social media
- Backgrounds: Manage map layers and background images



Where to find settings? 2/2



Respondents can change their answers after submitting them.

Make it mandatory for the respondent to answer this question before view poil results

- 2) Page settings manage the appearance of individual question pages
 - Using different backgrounds on different pages
 - Changing the page layout
 - Define the default locations on the map
- 3) Additional question element settings manage individual question elements
 - Styling options
 - Randomizing
 - Mandatory questions
 - Scale options





Using maps in your questionnaire


There are three different types of maps in Maptionnaire:


- Default maps that come with Maptionnaire
- Background maps: your own maps can upload to Maptionnaire
- Map overlays: Your map layers (e.g. shapefiles) that can be overlayed on top of your own background maps or default maps



Testing and starting data collection

- The preview mode is not public and the test data in the preview mode is not saved in the dataset
- In order to test and to collect data the questionnaire needs to be published first
 - After the testing phase you can filter out the test responses





Options for viewing and exporting results

- 1. Export the whole data set as an excel file
- 2. Maptionnaire analysis tool for map responses and normal survey questions
- 3. Export the map-based responses as shapefiles or geojsons
