

WAT Survey 2023

This WAT Survey focuses on your first year of study at our WAT Master's Programme, including our own common and advanced courses.

The survey includes four parts:

- A) Background information, including the amount of credits you have done as well as possible working during the studies
- B) The expertise gained during your WAT studies, divided into knowledge, skills, and identity skills
- C) Your views on the WAT Course in the 1st period, and on the portfolio and mentoring process
- D) Your experiences and feedback on the entire WAT Master's Programme.

Responding to the survey takes approximately 1 hour, and particularly the part about your expertise (knowledge, skills, identity skills) requires some serious thinking: please be prepared for this. For the same reason, we recommend you to first write your responses into a separate document, and then copy-pasting them into this survey.

The final page of the survey allows you also to view and save your responses: you can also choose to edit/update them still.

We have planned the survey questions so that they help you to reflect your learning. Thus, this survey also supports planning your further studies and we encourage you to use your responses when revising your portfolio (so please do save them for yourself, too).

In addition, your answers will help us to understand how well the programme is working and what you learned during its first year. This information is critically important to develop the programme further. We may also use the survey answers for research purposes.
