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DESCRIPTION OF THE COURSE

The Film Idea Incubator course aims to provide students with tools, time and guidance to discover, test, and take forward ideas for potential short films. This is a course to experiment and practice with creativity, to engage with the search for creative paths and to continue your artistic development. Students do not need to have a developed idea at the start of the course. This course is open to all MA-students of all majors of Film and Television.

The first week will be more focused on finding intuitive, playful, and spontaneous ways of working on finding and developing film ideas. The second week will continue the work of the first week; it will be more self-directed and will add more emphasis on defining and communicating film ideas. The course will have frequent in-class creative writing exercises, group activities and lectures addressing creativity from various angles and exploring different working methods. The course also emphasizes peer review over teachers' feedback.

During the course there will be an opportunity to get to know students from other ELO majors in the framework of an organized speed-meeting. This will provide a chance for the participants to get to know potential collaborators/team members for their current projects or other ventures. Students will also know the different possibilities for producing films within ELO.

NOTE: Student must come to the first day of instruction to secure their place in the course.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Students will be able to:

- Generate and brainstorm potential short film ideas.
- Co-create and analyze content with other students.
- Acquire tools for the development of film ideas.
- Know the different film production possibilities in ELO.

PRE-ASSIGNMENTS

Bring to class on first day of the course.

1. AN IMAGE

- A. Choose a visual image (a photo, a painting, an illustration, etc.) that is important to you. Choose an image that somehow moves you, makes you think or creates a strong emotion in you. It can be a painting. A photo. A poster. Or a picture from your family album. As long as it's important to you. Prepare to explain to others what the image means to you.
- B. Give the image a title and write two sentences inspired by this image. The sentences can be whatever you like but be precise in your observation and in your thinking. Think what you would like your audience to understand from your image and the text attached to it.

2. SHORTFILM IDEA

Bring a potential film idea for a short film to orally present it to the class during the first day. It doesn't need to be a full story; it can be a character, a situation, or even an approach, that intrigues you or a theme that you want to address. Presentation around 3 min.
