

COURSE PROCESS



ASSESSMENT

Your engagement (during the process) comes first, rather than outcomes (final deliverables)!

Four presentations (Role Model, Midterm, Production Plan, and Final) are key markers that you should demonstrate your active engagement in this course (mark the dates in your calendar).

Assessment Criteria

- Reflection (how you connect back to your learning experiences from this study programme to construct your professional narrative)
- Progress(how your narrative has improved based on the feedback given at previous presentations / tutorials)
- Communication (how your professional narrative and provided examples/projects are coherently and effectively presented)

TWO MODES OF WORKING IN DI3

Individual

- Overall, you are working as an individual.
- All assignments are submitted and graded individually.
- You are responsible for preparing materials to get supports.
- For the final event, you are responsible for setting up and taking down your own work.

Group

- Depending on the narrative, you will be under a theme (TBD)
- For your 'theme', you join a small group with your peers.
- Each group is tutored by HK (Design) or Tarja (Media) to get a theme specific support.
- For the final event, you are expected to contribute to setting up and taking down of shared exhibition structure / materials.

MIDTERM PRESENTATION: TWO POSTERS

2 sheets of A3 posters (vertical) / Due 08:00 am, 18 March

POSTER 1 should include (the order of the placement from the top):

- Your professional profile photo;
- Your full name:
- Contact info (email or/and portfolio website);
- Designer's Statement (max 1 paragraph = 2-4 sentences);
- Keywords (3-5 words, summarizing the statement);
- Aalto University logo (attached);
- The name of the program: Bachelor's Programme in Design; and
- The course name: ARTX-1007 Design Impact III)

POSTER 2: Free format / contents

- Align it with POSTER 1.
- It is to support your designer's statement / keywords.
- Think clever ways to make connections between POSTER 1 (your statement / keywords) and POSTER 2 (your project(s)). For instance, you can use icons, specific colors, etc. to create a visual system of labeling your keywords that are relevant for your projects.
- Properly reference your visual materials (authorship, year, project name, etc.

This can become a yearbook if you wish to make (Volutary works by the students).

FINAL DELIVERABLES: YOUR PROFESSIONAL IDENTITY AS A DESIGNER

Format: (1) a video (max 5 mins); and (2) artefacts from relevant works/projects.

Content:

- A brief narrative to illustrate your designer identity (further development from the Midterm)
- Must include your names, reference well all the audiovisual materials used in the video.
- Artefacts come from your previous/ongoing works (e.g. something you did as a group, something incomplete, something happening now such as your thesis)
- Artefacts will be served as tangible evidence to support your narrative.
- Artefacts need the basic info (title, brief introduction, including the project/course involved, date, location, collaborators, etc.)

Due dates:

- For the video: <u>08:00 am</u>, <u>27 May</u>
- For the artefacts: Before the final event (7 June)

Post-production:

- Opening and closing (with Aalto logo, etc.) will be added by a producer (to be hired).
- Individual videos will be grouped based on the themes.


