





It works**:

- 85% of Ashoka Fellows report that Ashoka has helped increase their impact.
- 47% of Ashoka Fellows report that the stipend was the first significant source of funding.
- 80% of Ashoka Fellows feel strongly connected to the community
- 77% of Ashoka Fellows received strategic guidance.
- 54% of Ashoka Fellows were introduced to funders thanks to Ashoka.






Proven impact of Ashoka Fellows



Bart Weetjens

Mozambique's landmine problem was once one of the most severe in the world. Bart's <u>APOPO</u> deployed its unique mine detection rats to clean up the country. Rats ignore scrap metal making them much faster at detecting landmines than metal detectors.



Claire Nouvian

With <u>BLOOM</u>, Claire led a focused, data-driven advocacy campaign against the destructive fishing practice of deep-sea bottom trawling, successfully shifting French supermarket giant and fleet owner Intermarché's fishing practices and getting the European Commission to protect a significant area of the ocean.



Kailash Satyarthi

90,000 children were rescued from trafficking and exploitation in India by a <u>movement built by Kailash</u>. Kailash became an Ashoka Fellow in 1995. In 1998, he led a global march against child labor, leading the ILO to adopt its fastest-ratified convention. In 2014, he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize.



James Thornton's <u>ClientEarth</u> helps governments write environmental laws, and regulators to enforce them. They have saved Europe's oldest forest from destruction, smoothed the way for environmental lawsuits in China, and helped communities in Africa's last great rainforest cutillegal logging.

Sue Riddlestone

Sue's <u>Bioregional</u> initiated the BedZED eco-village in London, based on 10 principles to live within the Earth's boundaries. She systematized its approach by creating a sustainability framework called "One Planet Living", which has been applied in \$30 billion of real estate development, and by local governments and companies worldwide.



Jos de Blok

Jos revolutionized community health and elderly care in the Netherlands. Today, <u>Buurtzorg</u> employs 15.000 nurses, has won "Best Employer of the Year" multiple times, and client satisfaction rates are the highest of any healthcare organization—all that while saving the Dutch social security system hundreds of millions of Euros every year.
