Career anchors (Edgar H. Schein)

Technical/Functional (asiantuntijuus & pätevyys)

Skilled professional or expert in a particular field.

General managerial (johtaminen)

Delegating, training, decision making, directing and dealing with people.

Autonomy/independence (autonomia & riippumattomuus)

Own rules and standards, independent work, self control of work.

Security/stability (turvallisuus & pysyvyys)

Calm, stable, predictable environments, no risks.

Career anchors (Edgar H. Schein)

Entrepreneurial creativity (luovuus & yrittäjyys)

Incentive, creative and energetic, new businesses and directions.

Service/dedication to a cause (palvelu & omistautuminen)

The desire to serve others, work reflecting core values, purpose.

Pure challenge (aito haasteellisuus)

Problem solving, meeting challenges, competitive, obstacles as opportunities.

Lifestyle (elämäntyylin integroituminen)

Balance of work, family and leisure, flexible working life.

Characteristics of an entrepreneur

A successful entrepreneur will possess many abilities and characteristics, including the ability to be:

- Curious
- Flexible and adaptable
- Persistent
- Passionate
- Willing to learn
- A visionary
- Motivated

Entrepreneurial drive stems from qualities like these, just as an entrepreneur's ability to succeed will depend on developing these abilities.

Motivation and entrepreneurship

- Some motivational concepts have been recognized to effect on entrepreneurship:
 - Need for achievement
 - Risk taking
 - Tolerance for ambiguity
 - Locus of control ('hallintakäsitys')
 - Self-efficacy ('minäpystyvyys')
 - Goal setting
 - Independence
 - Drive (ambition, goals, energy, stamina)
 - Egoistic passion
- Some cognitive factors identified to be needed:
 - Knowledge (especially of the industry)
 - Skills (depend on circumstances)
 - Abilities (necessary case-related abilities, including intelligence)
- The cognitive factors enable the entrepreneurs to develop a vision and strategy and carry it out successfully.
- Motivation helps the entrepreneurs to acquire the knowledge, skills and abilities and to implement the necessary actions.


