

## Joint degree student identity

You have rights and responsibilities of

- Aalto University (student status, degree regulations, code of conduct etc.)
- Entry/exit university (local rules and regulations)

How to balance between all the rules?



## Joint degree student identity: Grade and credit transfer

**Transcript exchange between university admins** - nothing for you to worry about!

Courses are transferred individually from your entry/exit university to Aalto University and grades translated to Aalto grading scale (1-5)
All courses from both universities count towards final GPA at Aalto

if your GPA is 4.0 or above and your thesis grade at Aalto is a 4 or
 5 → "Honours" mark in degree certificate)



## Joint degree student identity: Annual enrolment

As an Aalto student you must enrol as an attending student every year, even if you are studying at a partner university.

**Only** students who have enrolled as attending, can:

- Complete courses (either at Aalto or at a partner university)
- Receive mobility scholarship
- Get guidance from university staff
- Start Master's thesis process
- Graduate

If you fail to enrol as attending or non-attending student for an academic year, you will lose your study right.





## Joint degree student identity: Annual enrolment

Payment of student union membership fee is a precondition to enroll as attending

Enrolment is connected to permissible duration of studies


## Joint degree student identity: Scholarships and fees

#### Scholarships are applied and granted on an annual basis

 2<sup>nd</sup> year scholarships are applied during the spring, wait for the instructions from your exit university

If you take longer than 2 years to graduate, you will be transferred to the local tuition fee scheme of the universities (excl. 'grace period')

- Aalto: academic year 1 Aug 31 July
- Local tuition fee scheme will apply as of 1 August
- Tuition fee 7 500 EUR/semester for non-EU/EEA students (0 EUR for EU/EEA)
- Scholarships for one additional term (= grace period at Aalto): application instructions sent during spring term of your 2<sup>nd</sup> year; 100% tuition fee waiver to finish your studies before 31 December





## Joint degree student identity: Student life

#### **Get a Finnish ID number**

- Required e.g. for student healthcare, public transportation, bank account, employment
- You can get it with residence permit (non-EU/EEA students), by application to DVV (non-EU/EEA student who did not get it with residence permit) or by registration of right of residence (EU/EEA students) to Migri

#### **Open Finnish bank account**

- Online banking credentials strongly recommended (if you can get them)
- More information at Registering with the authorities and opening a bank account | Aalto University

#### HSL card and student discount in public transportation

- App. 40% discount in public transportation
- In order to get the discount, you should get the student discount form for **EXCHANGE STUDENTS** with an official university stamp and signature from the Starting Point (Otakaari 1) **and** visit the HSL pop-up desk at the Welcome Fair or HSL service point
- The discount can be granted for the period that you have currently enrolled as attending for, i.e. the whole academic year 1 August 2024 to 31 July 2025

#### Residence permit to your exit university country (non-EU/EEA students)

- · You need to apply for the residence permit to your exit university country through their embassy in Finland.
- Initiate your residence permit application to your exit university immediately as soon as you receive the admission letter unless instructed otherwise on the letter!
- · Enrolment as attending is required for RP extension to Finland

## How to get an access token and access rights

Buildings on the campus area can be used also during evening time

**Bitwards Mobile ID** is used as an access token on the campus are

- The app requires a Bluetooth connection to function
- Before using the Bitwards mobile app, installation of the Authenticator app on your phone is required
- Available on <u>Apple App Store</u> and <u>Google</u> <u>Play</u>



## **Programme structure**



Total scope of the programme: 120/123 ECTS

Studies at Aalto\*: 60/63 ECTS (entry) or 30/33 ECTS (exit)

Studies at partner university: 60 ECTS (entry) or 30 ECTS

(exit)

Master's thesis: 30 ECTS




<sup>\*</sup> According to Finnish legislation a higher education student must complete 3 ECTS of foreign language studies

## Planning your studies

Curriculum and degree structure = what you must and can include in your degree → Follow the curriculum!

Personal Study Plan (PSP; HOPS in Finnish) = how you plan to complete your degree

- Sisu: Registration to courses is done via PSP
- Your best plan to graduate for the time being can be modified at any time
- Play with the PSP to plan your workload per teaching period / semester
- Also, a tool used to apply for graduation at a later stage





## Study plan 101

Error messages appear whenever making changes to default curriculum (common) and inherit upwards



Selection missing = problems - DO SOLVE


Approval required = **SOLVE** (discuss with your programme director about your course choices)







## Language studies

**Recommendations** pre-added to study plan

All the 3 ECTS must be completed in one single language



LC-1310 Academic Communication for MSc Students (o,w) is recommended to avoid recognition problems at partner universities.

The language course is **mandatory** for those who have not completed a similar course in their **bachelor degree** in Finland or who have not completed / will not complete a similar course at the partner university.

**FAQ:** Timing the language course? Possible overlaps? Exceeding the 3 ECTS? Choosing something not marked with (o,w)?

What benefits you most > adaption to a new surrounding, employability, reviving an old language skill...

Exit students: take the course in the autumn term; entry students can choose the most suitable term, balancing the workload



## **Exemptions of compulsory foreign language requirement**

BSc degree from a Finnish university or UAS + foreign language course completed there = no need to take a language course

#### Native English speakers & others equally fluent in English

- 3 ECTS of Finnish instead (online course in Survival Finnish can be included!), or
- 3 ECTS of another foreign language course with "o" and "w" symbols (oral and written requirements) – note that you must be on intermediate or advanced level in this language

## **Course choices 101**

**Obligation:** minimum 60 ECTS + 3 ECTS language course (comes on top)

No maximum ECTS, but mind your workload

Conflicting schedules? Prioritize compulsory courses; if overlap only applies to part of course, discuss substitute assignments, lecture recordings or other with course teacher

Troubles choosing optional courses → consult Jani

Something outside course lists? Agree with Jani → inform Michael → add to study plan using "Free edit mode"

Only minority of available positions are published


You need networks to land the position
