1) WHAT?Portfolio basics

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Who has already done a personal portfolio?

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- A portfolio is a collection of student work created for the purpose of demonstrating their learning or showcasing their best work.
 - → Portfolios main aim is summative assessment + student-centered, deep & reflective learning
- There are various types of portfolios:
 - Growth / development / learning portfolios show student progress over time
 - Presentation portfolios show student's best work
 - Evaluation portfolios record overall student achievement for grading or evaluate how well a student has met established course goals

Personal Learning Portfolio PLP

Summative assessment of your learning process

- → Encouraging you to assess and reflect your learning process throughout your studies
- → Based on your Personal Study Plan (eHOPS) as well as your existing expertise

...in a visually powerful way

- → Documentation of your knowledge and skills
- → Portfolio can be used when applying jobs; complements CV

...together with your group and mentor

→ Portfolio process builds on series of Group Meetings and Mentor Meetings: portfolio = 'the object' facilitating discussion

PLP = PERSONAL PDCA

Portfolio follows the principles of **Plan-Do-Check-Act** cycle that forms the core of Aalto's quality management



→ It is about 'everyday activity with the underlying idea of continuous improvement'

→ Portfolio helps
1) you to check and improve the quality of your studies, and
2) gives us feedback about the quality of our teaching



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PORTFOLIO FORMAT

- The format for the portfolio is free, and it can also change over time
 - → Can be a personal blog, visual learning diary etc.
 - → Final product can also be e.g. business or research plan
- Most likely it will be easiest to start with a written document, and then see how it evolves
- Main point is to follow the given guidelines!

PORTFOLIO QUESTIONS

 portfolio must answer in one way or another following questions

Main question: WHAT ARE MY CURRENT KNOWLEDGE & SKILLS?

→ What is my current level of expertise in my field?

What have I learned so far during my studies (in & out Aalto)?

Looking forward question:


WHERE DO I WANT TO GO + HOW DO I GET THERE?

- → What I want to achieve during my studies? What is my plan for my future career?
- → What kind of knowledge and skills I still need?
 What kind of courses and activities will provide those?

GENERAL PROCESS

- 1) Students divided into Mentor/Peer Groups
 - → WAT: The mentor group stays the same during the entire programme, and has same Aalto Mentor (Professor, Lecturer, ...)
 - → MEC: The peer group stays the same during the entire programme, and is formed to be geographically diverse
- 2) Portfolio updated regularly
 - → Student groups meet to discuss the portfolio
 - → Links to your personal meetings with Aalto Mentor: portfolio submitted before each mentor meeting = documents progress & frames the discussion
- 3) Final Portfolio submitted at the end of the studies
 - → No grade, but is required to finalise the studies
