### 1. OVERVIEW

This Aalto-level course consists of two parts running parallel. The first one is lecture-based and provides an overview of the global online working environment and collaboration practices. The second part involves a team project in which students collaborate virtually with students from other universities around the world. This part allows the students to apply their learnings in a project that simulates virtual work in real business environments. The working language both on the course and in the virtual team project is English.

### 2. LEARNING OUTCOMES

By the end of the course, the students will be able to

- understand the differences of leading and working in physically proximate teams vs. geographically dispersed teams that may take many different forms
- identify critical success factors and challenges of online collaboration and virtual teams
- show detailed understanding of the best practices in managing virtual teams and online collaboration projects
- structure, implement and complete a virtual project in an international online collaboration context
- apply skills and capabilities for collaborating in networked teams that work across time, space and organizational boundaries using new collaboration platforms into the virtual team work

### 3. REQUIREMENTS AND ASSESSMENT/GRADING

#### Requirements

- Lectures 6 x 3 h
- Local course-related tasks: readings and learning journal (individual tasks)
- Global virtual team project -related assignments (individual and team tasks)

#### Formation of the final grade

- Lectures and classroom activity 15%
- Learning journal - reflective essay based on literature and lectures 25%
- Virtual team project 60%:
  - written report and results presentation 40% (*presentation, if feasible for the class size*)
  - individual contribution in the virtual team project 20%

#### Attendance

- Mandatory to attend **the first lecture** to confirm participation on the course and secure a spot in a team
- Mandatory to attend **four** (4/6) lectures but recommended to attend all six
- Mandatory to attend **all** virtual team meetings

#### Grading

Final grade: 0-5. Evaluation: 0 (fail) - 5 (excellent).

To complete the course, all the required tasks need to be completed and passed.

### 4. COURSE CONTENT OVERVIEW AND ASSIGNMENTS

#### Classroom Sessions and Required Readings

The classroom sessions (consisting of lectures and group discussions) together with the assigned readings will provide you with a profound understanding of the virtual work environment and its special characteristics and challenges. The lectures will also help you assess practices and technologies of managing a virtual project. The readings will furthermore familiarize you with existing research done on global collaboration and team management in virtual work contexts and strengthen your ability to critically identify success factors specific for global online collaboration.

#### Global Virtual Team Project and Team Assignment *(individual and team tasks)*

The course participants will also participate in a global virtual team collaboration project managed by the USC Marshall School of Business in Los Angeles. In this Virtual Business Professional (VBP) team assignment, you will join a global team consisting of students from various participating universities around the world. Your membership in the team will be randomly chosen and assigned by the instructors. Your local instructor will provide you with your team assignment and members' contact information.

Your team represents a management consulting company that specializes in branding/ social media management. Your task is to analyze the online presence of one of the suggested case companies) in terms of building and maintaining its reputation. Your team will write a report on the company's online communication tools and provide recommendations for how to improve its online presence. Please also note that top three reports will be forwarded to the case company for their review and consideration.

While the Aalto part of the course operates via MyCourses, the VBP project uses a separate virtual team collaboration platform for all international team communication, document sharing and virtual meetings. In 2019, this platform is Slack.

Please note that whereas individual Aalto assignments are uploaded only on MyCourses, all the materials related to the virtual teamwork project will be uploaded BOTH on the project's assigned online platform AND MyCourses.
