How to move towards or even know a desirable future?

(Utopian) thought of many kinds

Outopos = no place

Eutopos = good place

In imagining the perfect society

⇒ Draws attention to gap between

FACT and VALUE or IS and OUGHT



VALUE

Slippery concept, can be ideological and thus not open to (easy) refutation

Exchange value versus use value

Basic human values

Maslow's hierarchy of needs

Adding value = improvement?

⇒ VALUES ARE GENERALLY SPECIFIC TO A SITUATION AND A CULTURAL MILIEU





Values are often expressed numerically

• e.g. ("willingness to pay" surveys)

Values can be implicit, assumed, their details overlooked

• E.g. independence versus dependency, particularly important in an individualistic society

⇒ THE MOST SIGNIFICANT VALUES ARE NOT ALWAYS EXPLICIT



MAKING VALUES EXPLICIT THROUGH CONTESTING IDEAS OF PERFECTION

Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein or the Modern Prometheus* 1818





- It's not the monster that is the villain of the story, but the scientist who created him

- Imagining future relationships between humans and others
 - Nature
 - Technology
- Dealing with transformation "something has changed"
- A mode of anticipation preparing, impacting, but not forecasting
