Plagiarism prevention in Aalto University

Common reasons for plagiarism

- Sloppy work
- Inadequate writing skills (proper citations)
- Lack of time

Conscious attempt to cheat is rare

➤ Aalto University focuses on <u>prevention of plagiarism</u> because it is typically caused by careless work, lack of time or just because of lack of skills

Common forms of plagiarism

- Quotations or word-for-word citing without clear indication
- Minor changes to the source text
- Inadequate citing or referencing
- Copy and paste from an online source
- Direct translation without quotations
- Collusion co-workers are not mentioned or peers' work is included in an assignment that should have been produced independently
- Autoplagiarism

- 5. Practice your writing and test the system in draft-box
- Submission of thesis draft (Turnitin)

Turnitin Assignment Name	Drafts 1-5 with Turnitin report
Summary	 Submit a draft to get comments from your supervisor and to get a Turnitin originality report of your work. Submit a first draft to the part one, the next one to part two etc. See instructions how to submit a file into a Turnitin submission box and how to open the originality report: Turnitin instructions > Student submits in MyCourses Note: Files are NOT saved in the Turnitin student papers repository (comparison database) although you have to check the agreement box before submitting. The originality report is generated automatically after submitting, but it may take from several minutes up to 24 hours. You have to interprete the matches if they are ok or if there are flaws to be corrected. See tips how to interpret the originality report: Turnitin instructions > interpret the report If you get feedback from your supervisor via Turnitin submission box, see how to open it: Turnitin instructions > Student views feedback given in GradeMark Edit the draft based on the interpretation of the originality report and the feedback you get. Submit your next draft to the next part. This way the feedback on the previous version is preserved and can be viewed later. It is possible to resubmit a file into any part. Respectively, the originality report will be replaced by a new report, but not sooner than 24 hours after the previous report. Also the possible feedback can not be seen after resubmission. Turnitin draft-box

Submissions in draft box are NOT saved in a Turnitin comparison database

• Your future (updated) submissions are thus not flagged as plagiarised work

Draft box is used for work that is not finalized

- Examine your writing a safety check
- Problems in draft return are considered as 'practice' or lack of knowledge in how to write proper academic text
- Possible problems will result to further guidance and feedback
- > Discuss with your instructor

You should update draft-box regularly to check your work

- You can submit total of five draft submissions (5 draft boxes)
- Minimum: each seminar round (3)

Turnitin final-box

Final work will be submitted to the final submission box

• Instructors will evaluate the work you have uploaded to the final submission box

Problem in this submission will be considered as plagiarism

- External evaluation \rightarrow dean \rightarrow rector
- ➤ Further guidance, rejection or disciplinary action

Only one final submission is allowed

• Your final work will be protected against plagiarism as it is saved in Turnitin student papers comparison database



Summary

Two types of submission boxes:

- Draft submission box: used during seminar for work-in-progress
- Final submission box: used after seminar for finalized thesis, once your work will be graded

Reserve at least two full working days for resolving Turnitin –related problems when you submit your final work

- Technical problems possible
- Generation of a Turnitin report can take up to 48 hours
