A process-based course:

- Progress depends on students

- Students in more passive role
- Studying rather than doing


- Please make active use of the forums on Mycourses

Assessment

- Team assignments: 100% of grade:

Teams

Some tips for good team dynamics (Van Gelderen, 2017)

Task aspects are important, but also:

- Create a psychologically safe climate
- Stimulate 'creative controversy': i.e. disagree without monopolizing the conversation
- Set norms for social behaviour
- Get to know each other
- Be a good follower in addition to being a leader
- Pay attention to fairness aspects
