What is Raw Data?

Raw Data includes the real names and identifying details of the persons you have interviewed. You can discuss data with your group and DfG teachers, and also share it with ORSI, because our informed consent permits this. Otherwise, you must not show the raw data to anyone else.

Examples of Raw Data;

- **Your interview questions**
- **Informed consents = permission given by the interviewee**
- **Recoding of the interview (if available)**
- **Transcription of the interview (if available) –or notes**
- **Links to webpages where you have found information about your case organization, documents given to you by your case organization**

Sharing Raw Data with ORSI

As a part of DfG course collaboration, you will share your raw data with ORSI before final presentation

- Note: it is important that you share the raw data, not the anonymized data**

Confidentiality –how to use data in your final presentation and report

You must anonymize data you use in documents that the outsiders can see, such as your final report and presentation.

Anonymizing = removing or pseudonymizing all identifying details as follows:

Example of raw data (fictional example):

- “I cannot use a bus, I must have a taxi coming to my door, because my rare polymyocitis disease that prevents me from walking –Anna Lahtinen, 20 years, Living in Kivenlahti, Espoo

Example of same data, anonymized:

- “I cannot use a bus, I must have a taxi coming to my door, because my health condition that prevents me from walking –”Liisa” –a pseudonym, age group: 20-30 years, Living in Uusimaa region
