Talking about your work

Wie ist deine Arbeit / dein Job?

What is your work / your job like?

Mein Job ist vielseitig/interessant/stressig.

My job offers a lot variety. My job is interesting/stressful.

Wie ist die Firma / das Unternehmen?

What is the company like?

Die Firma ist groß / klein.

The company is big / small.

Das Unternehmen hat 50 Mitarbeiter.

There are 50 employees in the company.

Wie fühlst du dich in deiner Arbeit?

Do you enjoy your work/job?

Ich fühle mich (nicht) wohl bei Mingahaus.

I enjoy / I don't enjoy my work/job at Mingahaus.

Wie sind deine Kollegen?

What are your colleagues like?

Sie sind nett/teamfähig/(un)freundlich.

They are nice/team-oriented / (un)friendly.

Wie ist das Arbeitsklima?

What is the work atmosphere like?

Das Arbeitsklima ist (nicht so) gut / locker / förmlich.

The work atmosphere is (not so) good / relaxed / formal.

Wie sind die Arbeitszeiten?

What are the working hours like?

Meine Arbeitszeiten sind flexibel.

My working hours are flexible.

Ich muss (keine) Überstunden machen.

I have / don't have to work overtime.

What kind of a job would you like to have? Talk with your partner about your dream job.
