WHAT?

The crown jewel of your MSc studies

- → your opportunity to shine!
- → your opportunity to learn more & apply theory into practice
- → a stepping stone to working life or doctoral studies



30 credits: includes thesis + short oral presentation (video)

Thesis submitted in electronic format (pdf). Binding thesis not needed any more.

WHEN?

Thesis work can be started when you have completed a sufficient amount of studies in geoinformatics. If you plan to work on your thesis in January 2024, you need to look for the topic <u>now!</u>



Supervisor & advisor(s)

- **Supervisor:** a professor from the GIS MSc program
 - Henrikki, Maaria, Matti, Miina, Mirjam, Petri, Jussi (soon)
 - Discusses the choice of topic with you
 - Helps in finding the suitable theoretical sources and framework for the topic
 - Supports you in writing the thesis
 - Grades the thesis
- Advisor: your hands-on guide during the thesis process
 - Helps in the (daily/weekly) execution of the empirical part of the thesis
 - Must have at least a master's degree
 - 1 or 2 advisors per thesis, depending on potential inter/multidisciplinarity of topic
 - Usually there is more interaction between student and advisor than student and professor during the process

Process

- 1) Discuss your thesis idea with your supervisor (and advisor). Supervisors have a strong understanding of what is a "good" topic and what is not.
- 2) Apply for formal approval of topic in eAge (https://eage.aalto.fi)
 The Degree committee meets ~7 times per year to approve topics.
- 3) Prepare a research proposal.

 Details on materials and methods & schedule & <u>deadline</u> agreed with supervisor. Check with your supervisor how often they want to be updated about your progress.
- 4) Start working! Work, work!

 Help from advisor during this phase. Keep track of how much time you spend working on your thesis. Template for thesis available online.
- 5) Get comments from your supervisor on a thesis draft (/drafts).

 Submit a draft version also to Turnitin for a preliminary plagiarism check (in MyCourses under your professor's name).
- 6) Agree about presentation (video) with your supervisor.
- 7) Submit the final version for grading.

 Done through eAge and Turnitin.

Oral presentation

A video presentation (Youtube, Vimeo, Panopto, ...) 5-10 min video (detailed instructions available online)

Academic writing

- Academic writing is demanding, especially if you are not writing in your native language
- Academic writing conventions are different in different languages even though the structure ("IMRaD") of a scientific report is the same

Evaluation of MSc thesis

- Graded 1-5 (also 0 possible)
- Will be evaluated within a couple of weeks of its submission (i.e., not immediately)
- Evaluation criteria (details are available online)
 - Definition of research scope and goals
 - Command of the topic
 - Methods, conclusions
 - Contribution to knowledge, thesis structure
 - Presentation and language
- TIP: When writing your thesis, try self-evaluating it against the official criteria.

 Many topics / opportunities are not published anywhere – you need to be proactive & ask!

- Stick to the schedule!
 - Target time = 6 months.
 - Excess time spent on thesis lowers your grade.
 - Your topic is valid for one year you will not be reminded about it.
 - You cannot have your topic <u>and</u> thesis approved in the same meeting.
- Note the schedule of the Degree Committee
 - Dates: see next slide
