

Why plan? Why PSP?

PSP – personal study plan is

- ...a way of planning your studies, a tool for a student
- ...a chance for you to discuss your future goals
- ...forces you to make choices
- ...a document according to which you can graduate
- ...done for the whole (BA) degree length and scope
- ...a mandatory document for many applications
- ...updated yearly or upon student's request
- ...enrolling to courses

Minor minimum 15 cr





General studies 26 cr

All the ARTS BA students have the same courses.

Themes:

- Art & Theory Studies 9 cr
- Aalto Studies 5 cr
- Language and Communication Studies 12 cr

Aalto Studies 5 cr

Academic Learning Skills 2 cr

Cross-school course, min. 3 cr

- Course organised by another Aalto school
- Idea is to collaborate with students from other fields than art.
- It can also be a <u>University WideStudies (UWS) -course</u>.
- NB. you cannot take ARTS-, ARK-, ELO-, DOM-, MUO- or TAI- as cross-school course.

Minor min. 15 cr

- Studies around a theme or subject
- Supports your major or other goal (cannot contain major courses)
- Choose by your own interest
- Must be studies from higher education

Minors from other Aalto schools are open for all. Choose the minor in your PSP. Most ARTS minors you must apply for. The application period is in May (and in October)

Minors at Aalto

Remember, the minor can be from other universities in Finland or other countries.



Elective Studies max. 28 cr

Can be any courses of higher education:

- Electives from your own major
- Courses from other ARTS majors
- Transdisciplinary Art Studies (TAS) Elective Art and Theory Studies
- Courses from other Aalto schools
- University Wide Studies (UWS)
- Language studies
- Courses from other Finnish universities or colleges, flexible study right (JOO)
- Courses from foreign universities (f. ex. exchange studies)
- Internship (in Finland and abroad)






Making the plan in Sisu

- You can have several study plans, but only one can be primary plan
- Click the titles, not the arrows
- All your mandatory courses are in the plan automatically (NB! some choices must be made in the pop-out window)





Some tips

- If you want to delete something, do it via upper level, not by clicking the course
- Enrolment ≠ Adding to PSP
 - Enroll only through PSP but adding/deleting from PSP does not affect enrolment
- Study Calendar ≠ PSP

Study drafts

 Meant for exchange studies, JOO-studies, credit transfers, independent projects etc.

Free edit mode

- If you have done credit transfer and want to ad it into your plan
- Courses with varying theme
