DESCRIPTION OF THE COURSE

Theory, Art and Artistic Practices 2 focuses on helping students to gain an understanding of different approaches and methodologies in practice-led research/research through artistic practices in order to support them with the written part of their MA thesis.

Through lectures, discussions, writing exercises and assignments, students will become familiar with different research methodologies as well as different stages of the research process. The course aims to contextualize theory within art practice, helping students to identify research questions that stem from their own film practice, professional experience or artistic work.

This course is reading and writing intensive. Students will have to attend the lectures and complete the assignments in order to gain credits for this course. The two weeks of the course has to be taken in order to gain the credits.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Students will become familiar with practice-led research methods and artistic research relevant to their field of study.
- Students will be able to identify topics, research questions and critical literature related to their area of research.
- Students will be able to produce or develop different elements of a MA thesis proposal that will aid them in the written part of their MA thesis, or deepen the theoretical context of their practice-led research.

1. Pre-assignment:

Write a short description (max 1 page) of your MA thesis idea. What could be your research question? How would you approach your questions? Ideally your MA thesis addresses questions related to your artistic work, but other approaches are accepted as well.
