

Guidelines for the presentation-session on Feb. 16, 2022:

- Grading of the group work will be based on a scale from 0-40 points and represents the sum of the points that the group receives for the written report and the presentation (0-20 points respectively).
- Presentations should be given in form of an efficient elevator pitch, and should not exceed 5 min in length in order to leave enough room for discussion.
- Otherwise the style of presentation is free to choose with respect to format (e.g., “traditional” slide show, only presenting LSC-canvases, PechaKucha-style, no slides at all etc.) , how many team-members present (preferably at least one), and which software is selected (e.g., Powerpoint, Prezi, Keynote, none, etc.).
- Please be aware of the fact that presentation slots will be allocated randomly and are non-negotiable.
- Please also be aware of the fact that, in order to initiate a fruitful discussion, a discussant group will be randomly nominated for each presentation and encouraged to ask the first question/provide a first comment.
- A total time of 10 min is reserved for each group – including a max. 5 min presentation share and a max. 5 discussion share.
