



Disaster Management cycle




Disasters mean a serious disruption of the functioning of society which poses a significant, widespread threat to human life, health, property or the environment, whether arising from accident, nature or human activity, whether developing suddenly or as a result of long term processes, but excluding armed conflict.

Disaster may affect men and women differently, and they in turn have differing ways of coping with disasters.


In humanitarian emergencies, Red Cross and Red Crescent volunteers and staff help support and deliver:




- Search and rescue

- Community engagement, training and education.














Emergency Appeal process
