## Human-Non Human Interconnections in Art, Visual Culture & Everyday Life. Tentative Lesson Plan (January 13<sup>th</sup> - April 4<sup>th</sup>, 2021)

This iteration of this two period course will, due to COVID 19 be a hybrid experience with a combination of lectures online and an actual, site-specific premises in Villa Lil Kalvik, Vuosaari East Helsinki where I will meet you in small, staggered groups of 5-8 students (depending upon current COVID restrictions). You would therefore be required to travel to Vuosaari (zone B) most Wednesdays of the course

The area of Helsinki has been chosen as it presents a complex and troubled urban zone of contact between a diverse but unequal group of humans and non-humans.

The idea is that you will spend two periods from January to April devoting your time to researching an aspect of urban naturecultures in and around one particular site as the seasons change. You will also be expected to spend considerable time outdoors researching both built and vegetal environments.

It is expected that you take TAI-E3159 Ecology in Theory, Practice & Everyday Life 2 as well as 1 as the two courses are part of the same learning process. You cannot take part 2 without having taken part 1. There is no real cut off for Period 1

Please note that you would often be expected to work in groups during this course. First priority on this course will be given to ViCCA first years after that DoA, ViCCA minors and students with a proven interest in nature and urban cultures

- -An individual reflexive/critical essay about your creative practice project.
