1. OVERVIEW

In the seminar, students get guidance in their research for Bachelor's Thesis (57C99902, 10 ECTS). During the thesis seminar, students will attend lectures, prepare a research plan, report the progress of their thesis, present and defend their research results, act as an opponent, and participate actively in the seminar discussions. Note, that the seminar part (2 ECTS) will be graded separately on a 0-5 scale in addition to the thesis (10 ECTS) grade.

2. PREREQUISITES

There are no prerequisites, but the thesis seminar is recommended to be taken towards the end of the BT programme studies.

3. LEARNING OUTCOMES

The objective is to learn and practice independent scientific work.

4. ASSESSMENT, GRADING, FEEDBACK



The **seminar** is graded with 0-5 scale. The grade is weighed as follows,

- Research plan (40%)
- Seminar activity, self-study reports, including thesis opposition (50%)
- Final presentation (10%),

and based on the following requirements:

- Seminar sessions via Zoom/ Teams (80% attendance requirement, seminar activity is followed)
- Preparing for seminar sessions 12 h (preparing own thesis/slideshow presentation, reading theses and crafting two opponent memos)
- Doing assignments (research plan) 13 h.
