## Presentation guidelines and evaluation criteria:

## Slides:

- Does the title explains well your topic? Have all group members participated and contributed to the computations and preparation of results?
- How is the context of the work presented to motivate objectives?
- Are the objectives clear?
- Are the results understandable from the slides only?
- Are the Figures and Tables illustrative and clearly presented?
- Are the units and numerical computations consistent and plausible?
- Is there a well-reasoned focus in the presentation of the results?
- Are the conclusions justified by the results?
- Does the conclusions answer to the objectives?
- Are the tasks of the exercise covered to a sufficient extent?

## Presentation

- Is it easy to follow and understand the presentation?
- Is it clear what the context and the objectives of the study are?
- How are the main results pointed out in the Figures/Tables?
- Are the implications of the results clear?
- Is the presentation fluent and kept on a well-defined and justifiable track?
- Are there uncertainties recognised in the results?
- Are the conclusions presented pointly and clearly?
- Does the use of time go as planned?
- How were the questions addressed?
- How were the questions posed to the next group?
