## Instructions to the distant exams of ELEC-E8116 Model-based control systems 10. 12. 2020 (2<sup>nd</sup> intermediate exam) and 15.12.2020 (Full exam)

- First intermediate exam on Thursday 10.12.2020, **14:00**-16:00, Distant (home) Open Book exam. 3 problems, max 5+5+5=15 points.
- Full exam on Tuesday 15.12.2020, **13:00**-16:00, Distant (home) Open Book exam. 5 problems, max 5x6=30 points.
- You can participate in all exams if you wish. The evaluation is based on two intermediate exams+homework or full exam+homework. The better result is counted. You do not have to register to these exams. But for later exams you have to register separately.
- The exams will be given as Assignments, which are open for reading and submission between 14:00-16:30 (2<sup>nd</sup> intermediate exam) and 13:00-16:30 (full exam). (There is an extra time of 30 minutes for submission.) Submission takes place like in a homework Assignment as one pdf file. All course material is available, but you are not allowed to 'google' or search material otherwise, e.g. in the web or other channels. Also, you must not be in contact with any other person by any means during the exam. Exception: see the next item.
- During the first hour in the exams you can ask questions by the 'General Discussion' in the MyCourses page of the course. The teacher(s) decide whether a question can be answered. Note that these questions and replies are public.
- In problem zero you will sign with your signature that you have followed the instructions and regulations of the exam. **Please take this seriously.** If you use computer typesetting in your solutions, it is enough that you typeset your name (no handwriting signature needed then).
- You may write the solutions by computer (e.g. Word) and then change the file into pdf. Also, you may use clearly readable handwriting, take a photo by your camera, send for example an email to yourself, change into pdf and submit. Just like with ordinary home Assignments. Your submission must be **one pdf file. Please practice in advance that you**

are able to prepare the pdf file for submission. Note: you must <u>submit</u> the solution and not leave it as a Draft.

- You may use computer programs, calculators etc., but your solutions
  must not be based solely on them. They are just for help in calculations.
  The problems must be solved by 'pen and paper' just like in an exam in a
  normal examination done in the classroom. Consider the possibility that
  the problems might be such that software programs and calculation aids
  can be of limited help only.
- Keep your solutions just as you submitted them. This is for the case that something has to be checked later.
- One more time: Practice in advance that you can prepare solutions just like in a normal Assignment, change them into one clearly readable pdf file and submit. All this should go relatively fast and with no difficulty.
