THE PÄIVÄLEHTI MUSEUM

The Päivälehti Museum offers a unique combination of the themes of industry, technological innovation, recent political history and social influence. Its key purpose is to foster freedom of speech. The museum has developed into a significant meeting place where journalists, researchers and other opinion leaders interact and are also accessible to the public.

Exhibition architecture is based on experiences and activities. The museum respects the industrial feel of the old newspaper building where it is located and complements it with skilfully produced digital elements. Special attention has been paid to ease of use. In 2015, the museum won the Silver Award at the Best of Finnish Advertising and Design competition for its technological solutions.

The museum programme includes guided tours, lectures, discussion events, demonstrations, workshops, a museum theatre and much more.
