3. Giving a 20 minutes presentation as a group during the last session of the course (Tuesday 26.10.2021).





- Form a working space (Teams? Something) for collaborative discussions and documentation. Share the working space with Sara and Marja.



Minimum two meetings:

- 1st meeting: clarify objectives, divide tasks, planning of how to report the outcomes, check your timetables
- 2nd meeting: discussion on discovered answers, new viewpoints, new ideas and integration of viewpoints, planning the presentation of group objectives, process and outcomes for the last contact teaching session
