

## Presentation contents and dates

You will give two presentations of your research. If you are only just beginning, don't worry – this is your chance to toss around ideas for peer feedback.

**The first presentation** will be a seven-minute pitch. – You will tell us your theme, or the real-life issue or problem or phenomenon that gives you a justification for doing your research; your topic, which connects your work to previous academic investigation; your novelty, or, what new you expect to find out; and the general drift of your methodology – nothing complicated, just an outline: do you expect to do statistical analyses, or ethnographic observation, or what.
