## **Broad definition of tool**

- Tools can be anything:
  - Workshop facilitation **method** to promote interaction (e.g., thinking hats exercise)
  - Technical tools (e.g., computer software)
  - Physical tool (e.g., class layout)
- Tools can be either something you use already now or something you have learned during the course
