




### **Education system in Finland**

The main objective of Finnish education policy is **to offer all citizens equal opportunities** to receive education. The system is **highly permeable**, that is, there are **no dead-ends preventing progression** to higher levels of education.

The focus in education is on learning rather than testing. There are no national tests for pupils in basic education in Finland. The only national examination, the matriculation examination, is held at the end of general upper secondary education. Commonly admission to higher education is based on the results in the matriculation examination and entrance tests.
