# **REQUIREMENTS**

Attendance 80% and participation, reading assigned texts, completing required essays and tasks.

There will be one individual essay assignment/project (5-7 pages + possible images OR equivalent) and a presentation based on that, done in small groups of 2-4. You can choose the topic of your essay/project quite freely (as long as it relates to photography theory in any of the ways in which it is addressed during the course.)

### Your individual assignment/project will be completed in 4 stages:

1) Submit a 1-2 pages essay assignment idea/abstract/draft at the latest <u>6th March</u>. (Send as pdf to harri.laakso@aalto.fi)

2) Submit 1st full draft by <u>20<sup>th</sup> March</u>. The "first full draft" means that most of the material is in place but it is not yet the polished work. (Send as pdf to harri.laakso@aalto.fi)

3) You will work in small groups (decided by teacher based on your themes) and will do a presentation as a group – in which the assignments of all individual members of the group are represented (so that everyone gets to know what the others are doing). You may do this as a ppt presentation including all the projects, as a discussion or debate. Whichever way your group wishes. The presentations will be 24.3, 31.3, and 7.4.

4) After the course "officially ends" you will still have time to work on your essay/project – taking into account the feedback and ideas you have got from your peers. The final deadline is <u>24<sup>th</sup> April</u>. (Send as pdf to harri.laakso@aalto.fi)

#### Things to consider when choosing an essay/project topic:

\* An essay which relates your photographic work (/your interest in photography) to the theories discussed in the course.

\* It is helpful to study <u>one</u> key text/thinker in detail and structure your thinking around their ideas (the ways in which you agree or disagree with them, or think that they timely or out of date).

\* Think how is it possible (*or is it possible*) to address philosophical themes in photographs and films? How can theories be depicted in image form or vice versa? The essay can deal with the way in which philosophical ideas/texts/books have been adapted/adopted to films, issues of artistic research, relation of images and words etc.

\* An experiment in photography theory. Experiment with alternative way of writing/doing photography theory. (Can be a work combining images and words in a new way, a short video etc.)
