-Before the taste and fashion in clothing was identified in the client, the famous upper class person.

Like Marie Antoinette and Queen Elisabeth I, personal credit

-Before, the cut of clothing changed very slowly, and was taken care of tailors etc

-modistes of the earlier centuries dealt with imaginative trimmings, accessories and choice of fabric



- -In the middle of the nineteenth century France
- -romantic ideas about artistic genius -> original genius dress designer
- -artist as a prophet and hero
- -rise of the bourgeoisie and of the unconventional artist -> couturier as dictator
- -before, the tailor was never mentioned

Main difference beginning with Worth -> exclusive fashion as a business

-value of the commodity in its intrinsic design, not in its association with the public figure


-dress design recognized art, practice by artists with known names

-grand couturier created models with no particular client in mind






