### Learning objectives

## Understanding of the role of taxation in the decision making process of multinational enterprises (MNE)

- $\rightarrow$  Selected tax issues (or challenges) of MNEs will be introduced
- → The focus of the related reading packages is to give a broader understanding of what is international tax planning and compliance management, especially from the viewpoint of multinational enterprises
- → Through weekly lecture journals (or essays) students are encouraged to take a deeper insight into the topics
