Description of the course

The course will provide the students with an increased understanding of how to finance and produce a documentary film. The course will cover different phases of a documentary project, and the production and financing needs and strategies that pertain to them.

The course will take into consideration the different phases of a documentary project: scriptwriting and development, domestic financing, international funding and co-production, audience, outreach & impact and distribution, sales and festivals.

The course will be organized around lectures, visitors and case studies. The lectures will cover aspects of funding applications, budgets and written materials. The students will be given individual and/or group assignments during the course. The visitors include key people in the Finnish financing institutions as well as producers and filmmakers who will elaborate their take on producing creative documentaries.

Pre-assignment

Bring with you a documentary film project idea, even if in a very early stage. Ideally, it is an idea that you can work on during the course from the point of view of development, financing, distribution, marketing and packaging. <u>Please note that the course will not be about content</u> <u>development, but rather about how to make your idea into a project, what kind of resources are needed for the project to move forward and to become presentable to potential co-producers, financing partners, grant applications etc. Please note that it is also possible to team up with someone in the course for this purpose.</u>

Assignments

Course assignments will be presented to students on the first week of the course. The assignments will be carried out during the course and students will have independent study time to complete the assignments. Students are encouraged to work on their existing ideas during the course, even if they might be in early development.
