What it's generally about?

- How to generate new ideas in fields where creativity does not usually happen, like government institutions
- Proposes theoretical insight to "decomposing creativity" but does not give many practical examples
- "It's essential to be able to take distance from the subject and get rid of old dominant narratives"

Distancing and questioning current reality Designing an alternative

Creative methods proposed:

- Extension: extension of an aspect of an existing practice
- Grafting: taking an idea form a field and applying to another
- Inversion: do the completely opposite thing
- Addition- Add things, (solutions, measures, ideas)
- Subtraction- Take away parts (sometime not doing things is better than doing them")
- Mobilising metaphor and analogies: "Society as a war"
- Using Randomness: expanding possibilities and unleashing creativity
- Inspiring alternative ways of thinking through Storytelling

- Scenarios: bland but possible future scenarios
- Backcasting: Desired outcomes but time and lives are non-linear
