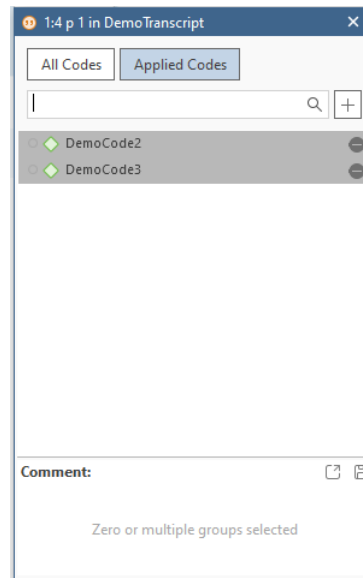
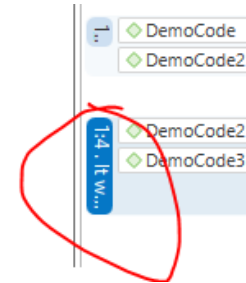


- **Apply Codes:** opens the window for adding new and applying existing codes

- **Quick Coding:** applies the last code you used



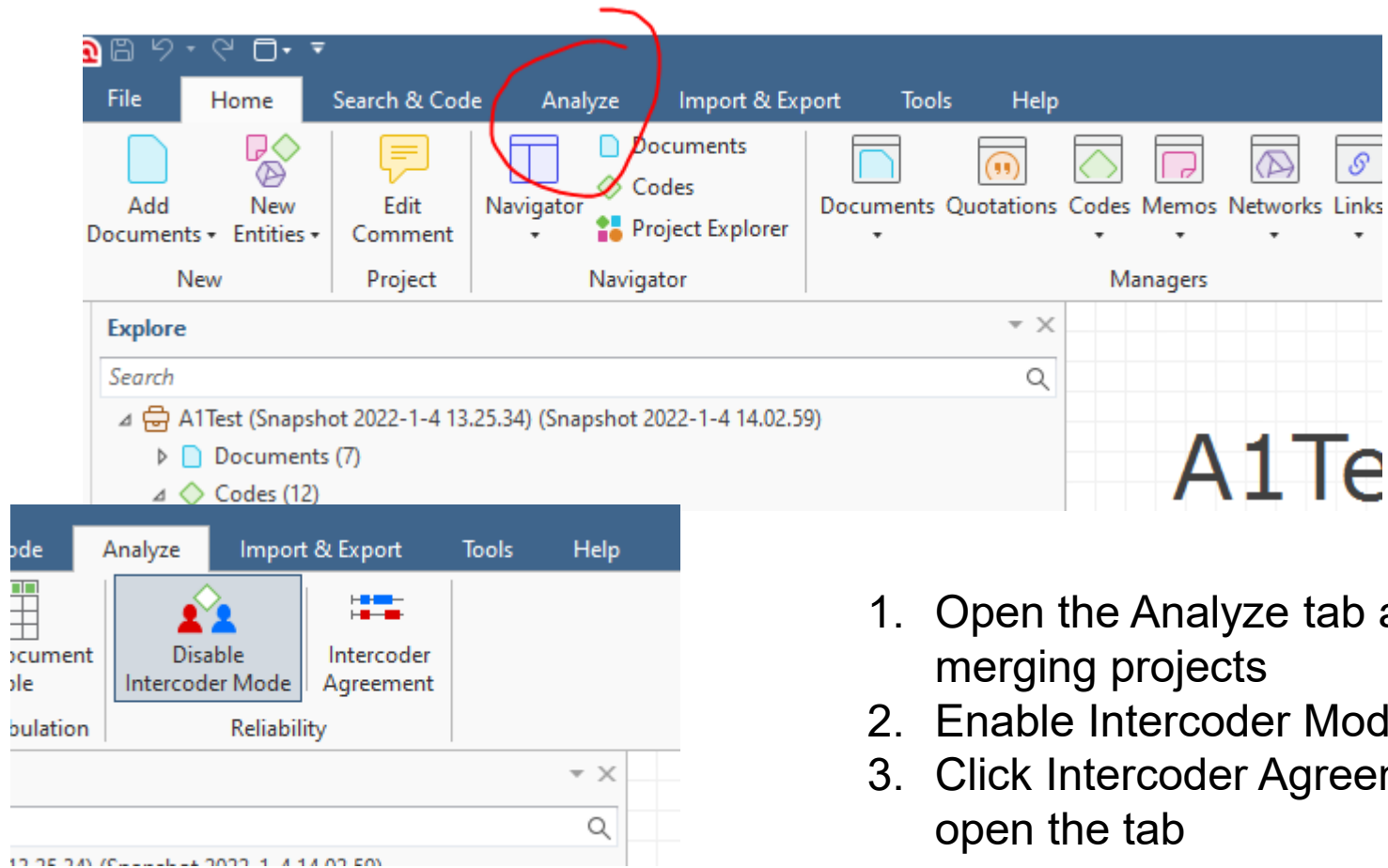

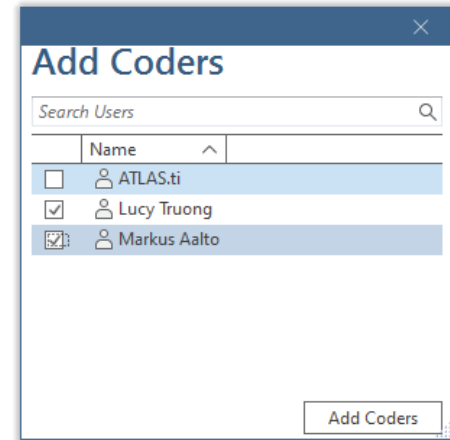
Intercoder Agreement Analysis



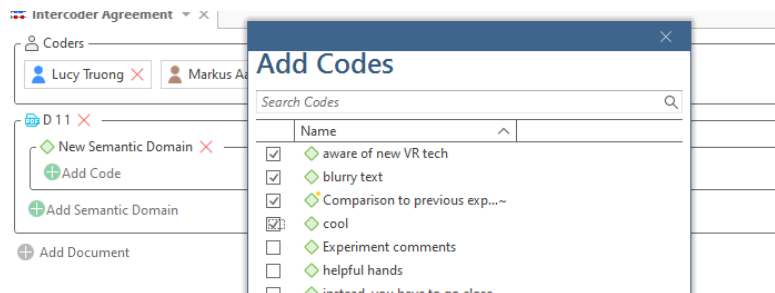
1. Open the Analyze tab after merging projects

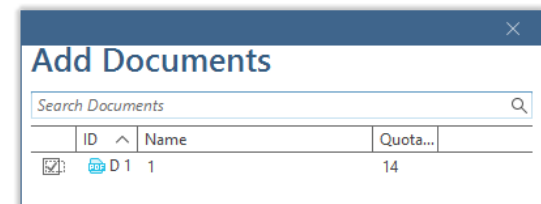

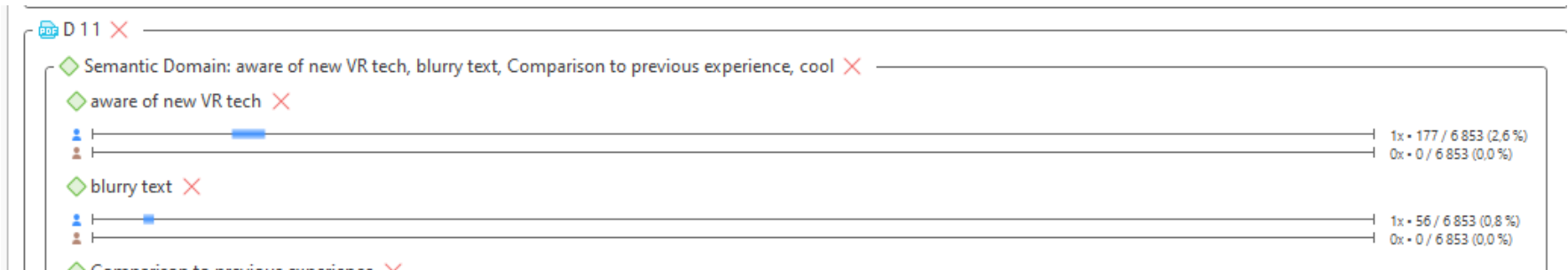
