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

Building Relationships

- BA Thesis = Great way to build new relationships within a specific field
- Groundwork for the future (academic / professional career)
- Professional/academic network vs. personal network
- Research participants: A group of relevant people who can share their experiences for your thesis.
- Experts: People who know what they are doing and have experiences to share from their field/expertise
- Experts can be your research participants. All your research participants don't need to be experts (e.g. users, consumers... whomever relevant for your thesis depending on the purpose of using interviews).
- Aligning your thesis topic with experts out there (Aalto University, Helsinki, Finland, Nordic...)
