Ethical Concerns?

Violence

- Possible harms to research participants: psychological / physical
- Minority groups and nonhumans (e.g. animals, plants)
- Intellectual property and authorship


Transparency

- Transparent research process (sampling, data collection/analysis)
- Informed consent to research participants
- Referencing

Reliability

- Unmanipulated research findings
- Data management
- Acknowledement of research convention and shortcomings

Plagiarism

- Academic communities, including Aalto University, take plagiarism seriously.
- Referencing:
 - Clearly acknowledging relevant work/research that you are borrowing to build your argument
 - Demonstrating what you are already aware of
 - Signaling what conversation(s) you are part of (e.g. male vs female, original vs cited, old vs recent, etc.)
 - Getting direct/indirect supports by citing previous work differently (e.g. direct/indirect quote, mentioning author's name as the subject of the sentence, etc.)
 - Playing with voices between yours and others.
 - Good skill to avoid issues with unintended cultural appropriations/intellectual property (Diet Prada!)
 See how John Galliano (Creative Director of Maison Margiela) references every single details to design something: <u>Link</u>

<u>Turnitin Originality Check</u> helps you spot (un)intended mistakes of plagiarism for textual materials!




