HISTORY


- Extension to Lasipalatsi, a landmark functionalist building completed in 1936 by architects Kokko, Revell and Riihimäki
- Building under constant demolition threat in until 1990s
- Exterior and interior restoration by Arkkitehtitoimisto Talli at the end of 1990s
- Complete renovation during museum construction phase

SITE

- Surrounded by commercial center of Helsinki
- Utilizes previously unused inner yard
- Five domes are the only noticeable change to existing landscape
- "Urban park as part of museum experience"







Museum shop on 1st floor




Amos REX 1.Floor 1:500

Suitable for **contemporary art**




STRUCTURE

Concrete domes connect the exhibition spaces to the exterior

Domes are clad with concrete tiles

Large spans, high spaces

Skylights provide sunlight and create dynamic atmosphere





EXPERIENCE
