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


Advantages of writing in pairs

 $\hfill \label{eq:social}$ - Social and academic fellowship $\hfill \label{eq:social}$ more fun






Finding a thesis partner

How to start the collaboration – match expectations! Discuss and ask yourselves questions regarding:

- <u>Timeframe</u>: How will you structure the process? Do you plan to hand in on time? Do you plan to postpone?
- **Level of ambition:** What is your mutual goal? Top marks, passing?
- **Topic:** What would you like to write about? Which research methods?
- Working methods: Do you split up the work or write everything together? Do you sit together or separately? Do you work better in the morning, afternoon or evening? For how long each day? Do you work on weekends?



Tips and advice

- Schedule and plan your time
- Evaluate your partnership regularly talk about problems when they arise
- Use your supervisor for advice in good and bad times
- Make time for friendship
