Case work process & deliverables

As the output, teams produce design concepts communicated in a poster, presentations and a project report.

Presentation days:

- Idea presentations on Tuesday 24.1. (short <10 min pitches with few slides)
- Final presentations on Tuesday 14.2. (<15 min presentation, 20 min per team including feedback)

Concept poster:

- Should include your theme, ideas in background, and your design concept with visualizations

Project report:

- Project report is a more thorough textual presentation of your concept with more reflection on the process and outcomes
- It should revisit your theme and challenge, background research, design ideation, interaction with stakeholders and the development of the final concept

Idea presentations (Tuesday 24.1.)

Groups present their case work ideas in next Tuesday (24.1.) session, tutors are present for feedback to all groups!

Idea presentation format:

- The format is a limited amount of slides (PPT or similar) supported with presentation talk; You may have only some people or then everyone speaking
- Each team has 15-minute slot including feedback, so the presentation needs to be pitch-like (less than 10 min)
- In your presentation, briefly discuss your interpretation of the theme and challenge, and idea(s) that you'd take forward; You may focus on a single idea or introduce a few for comments
- When discussing concept ideas, reflect on why they are fitting for the challenge, to whom they are targeted, and how they contribute to sustainability

if you want to take on an extra challenge, consider the following:

- S-group would like to see all posters incorporating the idea 28: *"revising food discourse to communicate that food is valuable and a precious resource"*
- Especially, in your poster texts, try to replace the following terms with more positive ones: "low-" (such as in "low carbon"), "substitute-" (such as in meat substitute), and plant based food as "special-" (such as when talking about vegetarian/vegan food as a "special diet")
