The final written assignment is a 3-page paper, consecutive pages (i.e. no gaps), from a section of the Master's thesis that involves critiquing literature (generally the pages worked with during the course). In this assignment, students demonstrate the application of writing principles from the course. Your paper is graded on a number of different aspects of your written ability:

The text employs appropriate illustrations and/or quotations. The connection between argument and evidence is clearly articulated in all cases. Comments:
Category 3 20%							Referencing: Follows appropriate conventions. To avoid plagiarism, integrates direct quotes, and clearly distinguishes direct quoting, emphasis, and literary works (e.g. titles). Comments:
Category 4 20%							Language use: All sentences are complete and grammatical. All word forms are correct and words are chosen for their precise meanings. Utilizes academic phraseology effectively. Paper has been spell-checked, uses correct punctuation, and has no errors or informal language. Comments:

The assessment aims at a critical connection between the argumentation, logical structure, and clear expression of ideas. The quality of the English must meet level CEFR: C1, as well as reflect the application of conventions introduced in the course. Accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar are expected, as well as accurate referencing.
