

Undergraduate Centre is an iconic building for learning, studying, lectures and working. The facilities are ideal for international congresses, seminars and events. The shining jewels of the building are the imposing and beautiful auditoriums.



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Undergraduate Centre is a landmark on the Otaniemi campus.

The main halls and the outdoor amphitheatre stand out in the landscape. The architecture and heritage of this culturally and historically significant modernistic masterpiece is carefully protected.

Formerly known as the main building of Helsinki University of Technology, it was designed by Alvar Aalto and completed in 1964. The new wing, designed by Elissa Aalto, was completed in 1975. After a renovation in 2015, Undergraduate Centre was recognised for inclusive design and received an award for its accessibility.
