



THESIS PROCESS


In the Department of Design



- We sometimes talk as if the Thesis is something alien and unfamiliar.
- Not true. Thesis is a design project and should be executed as such, following common design principles and process models.

- Double Diamond is a simple rule-ofthumb depiction of a typical design process
- You find out about the problem space, decide the most promising direction and move to the solution space, where you explore options and come to a conclusion.



- Thesis process as a simple Double
 Diamond could look something like this
- simplistic visualisation.


Another common visualisation of a process called "Stage-Gate" or "Phase-Gate"

a process where the work is done in stages or phases, and each stage has to be successfully completed before the project can move to the next stage.


Each of the steps in the process involves working in a manner that can be visualised as a Double Diamond.

The Thesis process involves Double Diamond features but, as a process, follows Stage Gate-logic, with one important difference: in the thesis process, you can go back to the previous stages and work on them until the final deadline for the project, the hand-in of the thesis.






- You are now in stage 1. In TPO, you will write a Thesis Plan Proposal, where you outline your plans for your Master's Thesis.
- Completing TPO opens the gate to the next stage, where you present your Thesis Plan Proposal in your Programme or Major.
- Your supervisor will act as a gatekeeper for the rest of the process and, for example, grades and offers feedback to the Thesis Part 1 and 2

Thesis Plan Proposal

- Approval for topic
- Playground for ideas
- Process guide
- Application training
- Problem solver:

Thesis Plan Proposal is...

- Document with which you seek approval for your thesis topic in your Major or Programme, after only a small amount of work
- Your "knowledge creation platform" and playground for ideas
- Guide through the thesis process, which you will edit as the work progresses
- Excellent training for application writing for PhD studies or any funding
- Helps to avoid common thesis problems:

The most common problems:

- Poor awareness of context
- Poor research question
- Poor choice of research methods

Poor awareness of context. A good plan is aware of the field of studies. There are links to literature, practice, and history. Limitations and boundaries are clearly communicated and justified. In a poor plan, there's a random set of notes or no context and limitations at all.

Poor research question. A good research question is clearly expressed and has motivation. Poor question is unclear, or changes throughout the plan or thesis.

Poor choice of research methods. In a good plan, a research question is targeted with a sensible set of methods that produce enough data to reach a satisfying level of confidence. Unethical methods, studying wrong people, unexplained emphasis on personal experience, and lack of motivation for decisions are indicators of poor planning.

USEFULNESS OF THE THESIS

 Thesis has a purpose: Trains in independent research and project management, evaluation, writing, communication, creativity and imagination, because it's demanding and challenging enough independent project.

Size of the Thesis

- 30 credits
- About 810 hours of working
- About 22 weeks of 5x8h working
 weeks = 108 days
- About 3 full courses
- About half a year of full-time work = 4,5 months

The text


- 25-70 pages of text
- Between 50 000 140 000 characters (including spaces)








Thesis Plan Proposal: IDENTIFIERS

- Working title
- Language of the thesis (EN, FI or SV)
- Your name and study major or programme
- Supervisor (if known)
- Advisor(s) (if known)

Thesis Plan Proposal: SUBSTANCE

Typically, the longest part of the proposal

Motivations and justifications for the topic

Outline of previous research (= summary of literature)

Academic and artistic research goals

Outline of production (if any)

Methodological choices. How are goals achieved?


Thesis Plan Proposal: PRACTICALITIES

- Financing plan, if needed
- Ethical considerations, if needed
- Possible risks which would make the topic too difficult or prevent you from completing the thesis on time

Supervisors and advisors

Supervisor (*valvoja*) looks over your thesis process and approves advisor(s)

Advisor (*ohjaaja*) works with you. Supervisors would be delighted if you could suggest someone!



Thesis is independent work but also a teamwork in the sense that you have to have a <mark>supervisor</mark> who - looks over your thesis process, - monitors the academic quality of the thesis

offers feedback for Thesis Part 1 and 2 + grades them (pass-fail). - Usually supervisor also examines the thesis (together with someone else) and proposes a grade.

The supervisor has to be the Department of Design faculty. Majors and Programmes have a pool of Supervisors, and one is appointed to you.

Your thesis also has one or two <mark>advisors</mark>, depending on your needs. Your supervisor can also act in both roles: supervisor and advisor. The more you have people in your team, the more you will have meetings.

Advisor can be anyone who's an expert in the topic of your thesis. Supervisor approves advisors. You can suggest an advisor.

When there are two advisors, typically, one advises on production and the other on writing.

Outside experts are paid for 10 hours of work; Aalto faculty are not paid for advising and will do it "a reasonable amount of time".

- Working with an advisor follows the same process as the entire thesis.
- Establishing a point of view, framing, structure, and methods = Part 1
- Conducting
 research/project/production = Part 2
 + Oral presentation for feedback
 about what still needs to be done.
