Pop-science pitch – individual (3cr)

- A stand-alone document that displays the writer's competence
- Important to hold the interest/attention of readers
- 1 page, dl 30.10
- Choose either:
 - Targeted towards a wider general audience (e.g.LinkedIn article)
 - 2. Aimed at a named person(e.g. editor)/institution/media



Journal paper extended abstract (3cr)

- This assignment prepares you to produce hard-hitting summaries of scientific content
- More details can be communicated in this extended abstract
- Use a professional academic tone and appropriate terminology
- Max 2 pages, dl 6.11
