1. OVERVIEW

In the course, students get guidance in their research for Bachelor's Thesis. During the seminar, students will attend lectures, conduct research profiling in literature databases of their topic, prepare a 2-page research plan, report the progress of their thesis, present and defend their research results, act twice as an opponent, and participate actively in seminar discussions. The final thesis version should take the comments received in the seminar into account, and be submitted to the ISM thesis submission pages along with the Maturity test: https://mycourses.aalto.fi/course/view.php?id=41550

2. PREREQUISITES

The thesis seminar is recommended to be taken towards the end of the ISM programme studies. Recommended course before the seminar: MNGT-A4002 Akateeminen kirjoittaminen or BIZ-A0105 Tieteellinen ajattelu ja kirjoittaminen.

3. LEARNING OUTCOMES

The objective is to learn and practice independent scientific work.

4. ASSESSMENT, GRADING, FEEDBACK



The course is graded with 0-5 scale. The common BIZ assessment form and rubric for Bachelor's thesis will be used when grading the thesis (80% of the course grade). In addition, 20% of the course grade will consist of the seminar working part, based on the following requirements:

- Introductory lectures (online self-study and two compulsory class meetings)
- Seminar sessions in Otaniemi (70% attendance requirement, seminar activity is monitored)
- Preparing for seminar sessions (preparing own research plan and thesis presentation, reading other students' theses and crafting two opponent memos)
- Writing the thesis

In detail, the grade of the seminar working part is weighed as follows,

- Learning diary reflections on thesis tutorial videos 20%
- Research plan 10%
- Thesis draft and its presentation in the seminar 30%
- Seminar activity, including two opponent roles 40%

20% of course grade

Final version of the thesis (based on the assessment form and rubric)

80% of course grade

All of the above activities are mandatory to be completed to pass the course.

The thesis is supposed to be completed and submitted within one semester and a delayed submission without a valid reason (such as medical reasons) will lead to a reduction in the thesis grade (1 grade deduction in the final grade). The reduction will be applied to students who do not inform their supervisor of dropping out of the course by the first group-based meeting where research plans are presented (i.e. on February 6 at the latest).

5. ASSIGNMENTS

The research plan is due on January 30, 2024.

The thesis drafts are due in April-May, 2024.

Opponent notes are due to 1 hour before the seminar session.

Final versions of the theses and maturity tests are due on May 27, 2024.

8. ETHICAL RULES

As a general rule, Artificial Intelligent (AI) tools such as ChatGPT can be used for ideation but not for content creation, that is, you should write the thesis yourself. However, you can use AI tools, to a limited extent, for checking the grammar or increasing the understandability of your text. In case you use AI tools for this purpose, you should always save your original text versions separately at your disposal, in case the teacher asks for them later on. You must also proofread your text yourself, instead of relying only on AI tools. Otherwise, the Turnitin software will provide a high AI-% score, which will lead to an inspection process. Please also note that you cannot use AI tools as a valid reference source, but you should yourself search for related materials, such as academic articles.
