INTENDED LEARNING OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE

That the student identifies the responsibilities of the role as a cinematographer and comprehends the theoretical basis of the different stages of the work within that field.

The student familiarises themselves with basic concepts and tools that are part of the cinematographer's profession.

By meeting professional camera crew members, the student gains insight into the cinematographer's position as the supervisor of their working group and understands the roles and responsibilities of employees in the groups, with which they have a managerial relationship.

The student gains an overview of the cinematographer's working methods, which are also practiced as group work. In addition to this, the student will gain an understanding of the professional skills and scheduling required to complete that work.

WHAT WILL YOU BE ABLE TO DO BY THE END OF THE COURSE?

Be familiar with the roles and responsibilities of camera crew members and have an understanding of their tasks and skills.

Identify what are the different sizes of shots and the fundamentals of composition that make up a scene.

Describe how the eye line works and the 180 degree line within a scene.

Execute building track and identify the issues with the use of grip equipment

Implement a variety of operating and focus pulling exercises.
