

### **Evolutionary Aesthetics: BEAUTY**

- Based on Evolutionary Biology
- Combination of philosophical aesthetics and evolutionary psychology
- Human mind a result of the evolutionary process
  - "Not a general computer but more like a Swiss army knife"
- Aesthetic preferences developed as adaptations
  - Functional products of natural selection or sexual selection, e.g. fear of spiders, snakes & the dark, disgust of spoiled food, admiration of physically fit features
  - Developed during the past 2 million years, fully developed 10,000 years ago (beginning of Holocene)

## **Evolutionary Aesthetics: ART**

- Some type of art is found in every known human culture
- A fundamental human need is being expressed and met by artistic activity 


  universality

Universal characteristics of human aesthetics:

- 1. Expertise or virtuosity
- 2. Nonutilitarian pleasure
- 3. Style
- 4. Criticism
- 5. Imitation
- 6. Special focus
- → Criticism: too many exceptions

# Landscape Preferences: "Savannah Hypothesis"








## Criticism towards Evolutionary Aesthetics (Welsch 2004)

- 1. Methodological reductionism
  - Aesthetic is more/other than a survival value
- 2. Thematic restrictions
  - What is the relation between human & animal aesthetics?
  - What is the (pre)history of our aesthetic preferences?
- No 2 should provide the central questions

### **Animal Aesthetics**

- What do different species find beautiful/aesthetically pleasing/attractive?
- Turn to transhuman aesthetics
  - Human is not the reference point, aesthetics beyond the human agency
- Aesthetic attitude in prehuman evolution?
