Note: (1) *Although* and *yet* imply that the contrast is **surprising** or **unexpected**. Use *although* and *yet* for contrast only if you want to make this implication. (2) *Whereas* is formal. (3) Use *on the other* hand when "on the one hand"... on the other hand" is implied.
