Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Present, challenge and defend a position on controversial topics from the fields of science and/or technology, including architectural sciences
- Organize arguments clearly, cohesively and concisely in speaking and in writing
- Collaborate in team projects

Content

Through individual, pair and team work, students gain knowledge in persuasive argumentation. They participate in project and individual work, including informal discussions and formal debates on controversial issues, while using effective argumentation and justifying their points of view. Students practise structuring speeches, arguments and counterarguments both in speaking and in writing as well as apply different types of reasoning behind argumentation. Students analyse speeches and sample texts to identify strengths and weaknesses. During the course, students receive constructive feedback on their written and spoken argumentation skills, give feedback to others, and reflect on their own performance.
