

EPICUS – A game of questions, interaction, and team work

Questions

- Start with the questions in your hand. Think of your relationship to these questions – why ask these questions (and not something else)?
- Keep question card with you one week. What kind of device it is? How your relation to it changes? What kind of questions/ answers/ thought rise?
- Make your own questions. What inspires you?
- Extra: Write a following question from your question card to post-it note and add it on the card. Next day add another following question based on the previous question and paste it on the card. Repeat daily. See how questions generate more questions and how they direct you forward. How following questions changed your original question and your relation to it?

Exchange

- Exchange your questions (question card and/or your own questions and/or your thoughts) in Hylo. Tell what is your relation to this question. How your relation have changed toward this questions. What would you like to know more, or less?

Team formation

Form teams based on your questions and interests. The task is to form a group, based on the convergence of generative questions, that focuses on a particular emergent technology or phenomenon.

1. Think of your mission:
 - advocacy
 - research
 - startup (business/Not-for-profit)
 - Critical voice
 - Mobilization group
 - Or something else?
 - What is the name of your team? Use imagination.
2. Go also through the idea work process as described in Carlsen et al, 2012.

Team work

For team work you need to develop a strategy and narrative for your team/group/mission/startup/advocacy.

1. Develop your strategic approach.
 - Your medium term objective? What is your group about?
 - Organize your group. Your particular roles, competencies you bring to the task?
 - What is your theory of change? How are you seeking to create change?
 - Who will you need to get involved?
 - What are your critical actions, milestones, combinations of effects?
 - How do you know if you have succeeded/failed?
2. Develop a narrative that tells the story of your group five years from now. What has happened? How did you succeed in your objectives? Surprises? Complexities?

Presentation

Get ready to share your group's mission and strategy April 4. You have 12 minutes to share your thoughts in class, followed by a discussion.
